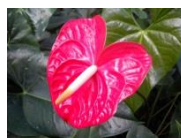

MINIATURE GARDEN COMPETITION

Fairy Garden Class 1 & 2 Rules of Entry:

- Garden containers must be no more than 50 centimetres in height with a 50 centimetre base
- The Garden **MUST** be a living miniature garden. No artificial **plants** will be allowed. However, decorations in keeping with the idea of a fairy garden, such as fairies, gnomes, their places of living or play spaces will help to bring the garden to life.
- The Garden must be in good taste and be pest free.
- Each Garden must be accompanied by a short paragraph describing the theme of the garden.
- Entrants are responsible for bringing and setting up (if necessary) their own garden.

Entries Close: 6p.m. Thursday 4th July, 2024. NO late entries will be accepted.

Class 3 Terrarium definition & rules

- *Terrariums are miniature gardens in a transparent container which is open, or partly enclosed [see picture beside]*
- *The container should be clean with a minimum amount of potting medium visible*
- *You must include at least three (3) distinct plants selected for contrast, or compatibility, and arranged tastefully, as a garden or landscape, to fill the container*
- *Any artificial supports (e.g. stakes or wires) must be unobtrusive;*
- *Plants should be well grown, clean and healthy, without dead or damaged leaves*
- *Ornaments, are permitted but must be in keeping with the overall arrangement*
