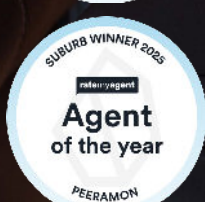
Show Hall Schedule general rules and procedures

- Opening times – drop off times are listed at the beginning of each section and on the **Closing time for Entries** page.
- Pick up time - No exhibit to be removed from the Hall until after 3.30pm Sunday of the show. All exhibits must be collected between 3:30pm and 6pm on the Sunday of the show.
- Entry fees are to be paid in cash.
- All exhibits must be marked off by Stewards before leaving the pavilion. **Tickets must be presented by exhibitor before item is presented.**
- The Show Society will take all possible care, but no responsibility of any kind will be accepted for damage or loss to exhibits.
- **Most Successful Exhibitor Scoring in relevant sections:**
 - 1st 3 points
 - 2nd 2 points
 - 3rd 1 point
- Judge's decision is final, and no verbal or written communication will be entered into.
- Judges reserve the right to not award a place/champion if standards are not suitable. Champion or any other prize will be withheld if the Judge deems the exhibit substandard.
- Special classes will be left to the Judge's discretion.
- Stewards reserve the right to categorize entries as per correct sections in the Schedule.
- All exhibits must have been created within the 12 months prior to the Show.
- Main prizes will only be awarded if all classes in sections have sufficient entries.
- All exhibits to be bona-fide work and property of exhibitor.
- Entry fee for all hall exhibits is \$2 unless otherwise stated.
 - Entry is free in Junior classes. For children entering an adult class, entry fee is at the discretion of the section Steward and Chief Hall Steward.

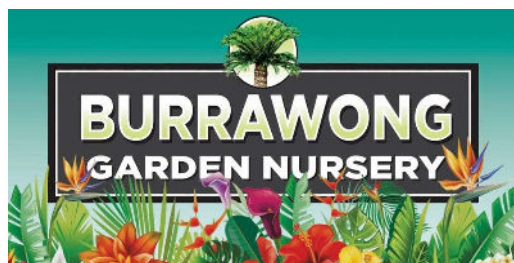

- Malanda hosts the Sub-Chamber Final for the Dark Rich Fruit Cake Competition, and the cake must be cooked under the conditions of entry for this competition.
 - Must be a 500gm (1lb) cake mixture with approximately 2.25kg of dried fruit using currants (whole); sultanas and raisins (cut); mixed peel; with cherries and nuts optional. Prunes and figs are not permitted.
 - Cake to be baked in a square 25.5cm (10inch) cake tin internal measurements.
- The winner is entitled to enter in the State Finals at the RNA in August 2026. If the winner doesn't wish to enter then the second-place getter is eligible to enter in their place. *Please note: Cakes will no longer be returned to exhibitor once judged in Brisbane due to Food Safety Regulations.*
- Prize money for this class includes reimbursement for the cost of the ingredients for the cake to go to the RNA and postage to and from Brisbane, as well as the **listed amounts**

CLASS 17 ANZAC BISCUIT – QUEENSLAND AG SHOW COMPETITION

This competition is only open to ages **18-40 years** as of 1st May of the year of competition.

The winner of the competition at Malanda Show, will bake a new batch of ANZAC biscuits for entry to the Show Sub-Chamber final (which is a competition of all shows in our area, location yet to be advertised). If successful at this level, the competitor is to bake a new batch of biscuits for the State Final Judging at the Brisbane Exhibition (EKKA).

If successful, Malanda Show will cover the cost of postage to Brisbane.

The ANZAC biscuits must use the supplied recipe.

State Final ANZAC Biscuits – Recipe and Presentation

- 6 biscuits are to be presented for judging.
- Biscuit size to be 5-7cm in diameter and crisp

The ingredients listed below must be used.

CWA ANZAC biscuit recipe (Ingredients for 24 biscuits):

- 125gm butter, chopped
- 1 cup plain flour
- ½ tsp bicarb soda
- 1 cup rolled oats
- 1 cup caster sugar
- 2 tbs golden syrup
- 2 tbs boiling water
- ¾ cup desiccated coconut

Method:

Combine butter and golden syrup in a pan, stir overheat until butter is melted.

Stir in combined soda and water, then remaining ingredients. Mix well.

Drop rounded teaspoons of mixture about 4cm apart on greased over trays and flatten slightly. Bake in a slow oven for about 20 minutes or until slightly brown.

Cool on tray.

Queensland Ag Shows will send a State Finals invitation to the WINNER within one (1) month of the State Competition. A Sub-Chamber Runner Up may be invited to compete ONLY if the Sub-Chamber Winner does not accept the invitation to compete.

1 State Final Judging

- 1 This competition is only open to ages 18-40 years as at 1st May of the year of competition.
- 1 Only one (1) entry permitted from each Sub Chamber per competition.
- 1 After Sub Chamber selection, each Sub-Chamber competitor is to bake a new batch of biscuits for the State Final Judging.
- 1 The ANZAC biscuits must use the supplied recipe and must meet the State Final ANZAC Biscuit - Basic Requirements listed below in Section 2.
- 1 Entry Form is to be completed and forwarded with the ANZAC biscuits. Entry forms are available at www.qldagshows.com.au.
- 1 Judging of biscuits takes place on the date advised in the invitation and will be set by the Queensland Ag Shows Board no later than 30th June of the year prior to the competition.
- 1 The biscuits are to be delivered to the Queensland Ag Shows Office, by the date indicated on the invitation. Biscuits not received by this date will not be eligible to compete. It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that the biscuits are delivered to the Queensland Ag Shows Office
- 1 The biscuits are to be well wrapped and packed in a strong box. If a delivery service is used it is recommended to line the box with 3 ply or similar material to prevent any damage during carriage.
- 1 Arrangements will be made to display the biscuits. Any certificates or prize ribbons will be posted to competitors.
- 1 All care will be taken with exhibits, but no responsibility taken.
- 1 Queensland Ag Shows reserves the right to vary these Conditions of Entry at their discretion and advise competitors of the changes to the Conditions should the circumstances require.
